



What's Happening in the Classroom?

Welcome back everyone, we hope that you have had a lovely Summer break with your children and are ready for an action-packed term to begin Year Two!

Our topic this term is Fire in the City. The children have shown an interest in learning about where and how the Great Fire of London started and are especially excited to learn in our bakery, otherwise known as the role-play area!

The children will also learn about where the fire started and Samuel Pepys' role throughout the fire. They will also sequence the events in order and analyse houses during this period.

In Literacy, we will be writing a letter to the King, in the role of Mr. Farriner, apologising for the outbreak of the fire, desperately pleading for forgiveness after considering the purpose, features, structure and language of formal letters. We will also be exploring some poetry before writing about a fire's behaviour.

We will be looking at number work in maths, focussing on place value and using this to identify and represent two-digit numbers before comparing and ordering them. We will also focus on addition and subtraction as well as some measure work.

Teacher Notes

- PE is on a Thursday and Friday so please ensure that children bring their complete school kit in on a Monday and leave it in school to take home on a Friday. Please ensure that your child's reading folder is in school, along with their reading and comment books - communication with yourselves is highly valued. Children will continue to receive spellings and times tables to practise on a Monday and will be tested on a Friday.
