

PE and Sports Premium

Since October 2013, the Government has provided all schools with sports premium funding. Each school receives £8,000 and then an additional £5 per child in Years 1 to 6.

In 2017, it was re-introduced, whereby schools are given £16,000 and an additional £10 per pupil.

The Department for Education states its vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is for all pupils leaving primary school to become physically literate with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

It is expected that schools will see an improvements against the following five key indicators:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity kick starting healthy active lifestyles.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and school sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

Sports premium funding 2017/18

At New Penshaw Academy we are using our sports premium funding in 2017/18 to:

- Fully participate in local cluster school competitions.
- Increase the provision for children to participate in school clubs, at lunchtime and after school.
- Develop PE teaching through the opportunities to observe and team teach with qualified coaches.
- Develop links to local sports clubs and advertising clubs, including the Foundation of Light Sunderland AFC link.
- Develop children's understanding of leading a healthy lifestyle.
- Developing sports leaders in KS2.
- Purchasing specialist equipment and teaching resources to develop traditional, non-traditional activity or new sport.
- Encourage all children to participate in sports and recognise their own achievements.
