Nature of support

The government offers funding to tackle inequalities between children on free school meals and their peers called the pupil premium. Pupil Premium funding supports pupils who are currently eligible for free school meals, or who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last six years.

For the academic year 2018/2019 our pupil premium funding was £104,920 which we allocated to the following areas:

- The retention of support staff
- Subsidising Educational visits including residential visits and transport costs
- Nurture groups
- Extended hours and tuition for KS2 pupils
- Staff CPD
- Attendance monitoring
- Resources
- Subsidising Breakfast Club and After School Clubs

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Funding for breakfast club and after school clubs • Attendance monitoring 	<p>learning through opportunities for enrichment experiences which they may not otherwise have had and to enhance emotional well-being and confidence through trying new skills in order to raise self-esteem.</p> <p>Disadvantaged pupils are able to access the breakfast club free of charge when needed as well as receiving after school club provision for a reduced cost. In total, 37% of pupils in receipt of pupil premium funding have accessed an after school club using this funding.</p> <p>Persistent absence of PP children is quickly identified and targets put in place to secure improvements in attendance for this group. Across the school year, attendance for children in receipt of PPM funding rose by 1.2%. Parents/Carers continue to be accountable to explain all absence from school.</p>

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The impact of that expenditure on pupil premium children was as follows:

- All children received specific individual support with core subject intervention sessions. This targeted provision was successful for most pupils in enabling them to catch up with other pupils if they had fallen behind and for others, to accelerate their progress further.
